Founded in 2009, Field of Crosses is the inspiration of Calgary businessman and philanthropist, Murray McCann. His gratitude for our veterans, serving members of the Canadian military and families of the fallen inspired the powerful display of over 3,700 crosses that stand as silent sentinels along Memorial Drive every November.

The mission and commitment of Field of Crosses is to foster patriotism and ensure present and future generations never forget those who have served and made the ultimate sacrifice. Each year, thousands of Albertans walk among the crosses and attend daily ceremonies where we honour the memory of our fallen.

Field of Crosses has transformed since its inception, from a small privately funded initiative of a few hundred crosses to a large community of dedicated volunteers and sponsors. Throughout the month of November, Field of Crosses hosts eleven days of sunrise and sunset ceremonies that bring our community together to honour our fallen. These events feature many elements of community involvement from school choirs, pipers and buglers to military personnel, Memorial Cross families and other special groups.

In addition, Field of Crosses offers guided tours of the field for the corporate community and youth groups. We welcome those interested to schedule a tour to learn more about Canada's military history and the fallen commemorated within.
